EXCLUSIVE: Amazon is exploring the world of teenage girls and shoplifting in its latest comedy pilot.

The streamer has ordered and shot half-hour comedy pilot Lifted starring Ivy Wolk, Veronica Taylor, Kate Godfrey and Annie Marie Elliot.

The project comes from Jawline director Liza Mandelup and Yeast director Mary Bronstein, who have co-created it and write and exec produce. Mandelup will also direct with Heidi Schreck, a Nurse Jackie writer whose Broadway play What the Constitution Means to Me aired on Amazon, exec producing.

A24 is producing with Amazon Studios.

The pilot explores the lives of four geographically, socio-economically, and racially diverse American teenage girls united by an online community built around shoplifting. A commentary on identity and how we communicate now, Lifted follows these young, awkwardly funny characters as they attempt to find themselves, form relationships, and discover their power and purpose.

Wolk is best known for her role on Freeform's Everything's Gonna Be Okay and also appeared in the Judd Apatow film The Bubble. Taylor recently starred as Bobbi in the second season of the hit HBO series Euphoria. Godfrey has starred in Nickelodeon series Warped! and Side Hustle. Elliot starred in Eddie Alcazar and Stephen Soderbough's Perfect and opposite Tanzyn Crawford in Pocketshock.

Wolk is represented by Paradigm, Avalon Management and Brecheen Fedlman Breimer Silver Thompson. Taylor is represented by Paradigm and Industry Entertainment. Godfrey is repped by A3 Artists Agency, Schuller Talent Management and Darren M. Trattner of Jackoway Austen Tyerman. 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

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

Kate Godfrey on Balancing The Double Pan Scale

A double-pan balance is a scale that has 2 pans that are balanced against each other. The scale functions like a see-saw, with each of the 2 pans attached to a beam over a centered pivot point. The two pans are codependent on one another, the pans move in conjunction to one another, originally used to balance coins. We have seen the dynamic between the two pans evolve with our culture. Work-Life Balance being one of the most striking examples, arguably most working adults can attest to the struggle of "leaving their work at work". With the growth of the internet, and emergence of social media in the workplace we can see that now more than ever we need to balance this scale. And because Our Era caters to mostly, well, Our era many of us do not work full time jobs. For most of us our work life balance is a school-life balance. And speaking for myself and likely many others, as social media grows, especially post-pandemic, balancing this scale can feel comparable to summiting everest. It is almost inconceivable to conceptualize having to balance high-school, schoolwork, spending time with your family, spending time with friends, AP Classes, Red Carpet Appearances, interviews, thousands of fans, late night appearances, and filming a full season of a television show.

But that is exactly what Kate Godfrey does, and she does it with a commendable amount of maturity, and humility.

From a young age Godfrey felt a calling to perform, first tasting the spotlight playing a fork in *Beauty and The Beast* at her local theater. And from the

moment she stepped off that stage she felt a calling to perform. Godfreys innate ability to entertain coupled with her diligence on and off camera makes her a name to know. Godfrey states that still she "gets that thrill stepping onto set and while it is different then performing in a theater hall there is nothing like performing" and that feeling is what pushes her along to continue to strive for more. While her roots may be planted in the mezzanine, Godfrey garnered much attention for her role on nickelodeon's *All That*. The show is a reboot of the 90's kids sketch comedy show, the show was deemed *Americas #1 Kids Sketch Comedy*, setting the expectations for the reboot through the roof. " I definitely was nervous to fill their [previous cast'] shoes'' Godfrey describes "but once the show aired the pressure subsided". The show premiered in early 2019, and production was brought to a halt due to the pandemic.

I am sure many of you remember March of 2020 when it felt like everything stopped. We have all seen the states, the toll this pandemic has taken on our culture. However Godfrey recalls that time stating "first it was a week, then two week, then a month", that as the uncertainty grew so did Godfreys desire to get back on set, and continue performing. Godfrey's ability to shift her outlook and persevere despite the circumstances speaks to her maturity despite her age.

One of Godfreys most striking qualities is her composure, while only spending an hour on zoom with her. The 18 year old explained she had taken an AP exam that day. Which is a daunting task for any full time student, I cannot imagine walking the tightrope of full time academics and rising into the spotlight. Godfrey explained to me that " I was fortunate enough to have a relatively normal high school experience",





corroborating that while she would miss class every once in a while she got to experience a lot of traditional high school. Godfrey described that just that just before she sat down for the interview she was finishing her AP psych exam, and the weekend before she had gone to prom.

Yet, Godfrey describes that this road less traveled she has chosen to take is not without obstacles, she says it can often be hard to resist the temptation to "engage with negative comments". It is called the world wide web for a reason, millions of people can give unsolicited input, advice, and opinions on complete strangers content oftentimes seems insurmountable. In this age where the internet is only growing, this task is often a teenager's Everest, subtracting the spotlight from the equation almost every teenager can empathize with Godfrey. Constant pressure to perform, academically, in sports, in theater, in whatever your prerogative may be, can make or break many teens mental health, however Godfrey's wise words and optimism serve as a light in the often dark world of social media.

VT: Another great news is that recently your new show Warped was released. What can you tell us about it?

KG: Warped is a new sitcom about teens working in a comic book store. It is filled with slapstick comedy as well as vibrant characters. In every episode, Ruby, my character, gets into some sort of trouble.

VT: Thinking about the roles you have been playing so far, what do you think comedy has brought to your life?

KG: I think comedy has brought me a lot of confidence. Even though I am usually doing something so odd that it is almost embarrassing, I seem to have found a strength I didn't know I had.

I am pretty shy in person, so being able to play really outgoing characters has been totally beneficial to me.

VT: Let us get to know you a little better. So, how do you manage to continue with your formal education while working in the media?

KG: I am currently a senior in High School at a school in LA. I have always tried to prioritize my education, but as I get older, I have realized that my work is really important to me and calculus is not.

I have applied to a few colleges, so at the moment, I am just taking it day by day. If I went to college, I would love to study business entertainment or something similar to become a producer of some sort.



VT: Usually, what do you do before going live on a stage or starting filming?



VT: Which plans do you have for the future?

KG: I have a rough draft of what I want my future to look like. I would love to become a writer or producer of some sort: possibly for sitcoms. I also love the idea of directing or being a cast member of SNL. I want to continue comedy but also introduce more dramatic roles. Whatever I end up doing, I know I want to stay within the entertainment industry.

VT: What message would you like to share with those who find joy in your work, despite everything that happens in the world?

KG: I mean, it is a cool thought to think that people find joy in my work.

I guess I would just say thank you. It makes me so happy that you like it.

It is a weird time in life. I hope everyone is hanging in there.



You star as Ruby in "Warped!" Take us through the process of getting into character for this role. Do you relate to Ruby in any ways?



What's a fun fact about yourself, and why did you decide to become an actress?


A fun fact about myself is that I have never had a goldfish for longer than 2 months.



We got to chat with actress Kate Godfrey about her role as Ruby in the new Nickelodeon show *Warped!* and how her time on *All That* helped prepare her for the role.





Was there a particular movie or television show that sparked your interest in acting?

I don't know if there was a particular show or movie, I always just liked them all. In everything I watched I was fascinated by the creative side and behind the scenes. The idea that every television episode is not real life but a made-up story, was fascinating to me.

Tell our readers about Warped! What drew you to the role of Ruby?

I was drawn to Ruby because she is a mix of all my characters I played on *All That*. She has many aspects of her personality; Ruby is my dream comedic character. I can experiment with jokes and make any choice I want, and still be "in character."

Are there similarities between you and your character Ruby?

I go back and forth on this question. In some ways, we are the exact same, and in some ways, we are polar opposites. I am much quieter than Ruby is. I admire that Ruby is unapologetically herself, she doesn't question any social situation. But we also have very similar types of humor. A lot of the things Ruby says truly do make me laugh.

How have you and your castmates bonded off of set to create a chemistry that is shown on screen?

The four of us all came in with open minds, and now we are genuinely great friends. When you are on a sitcom, the cast definitely has something to bond over. We all went to dinner and talked about ourselves. We actually clicked right off the bat. After the initial awkward hangout, it was so easy and fun.

Do you feel that working on All That helped prepare you for your role in Warped!?

Without *All That* I would have no idea what I am doing. That show taught me everything I know. I absolutely loved working on *All That*. It was a great training ground for young comedians. It was literally my playground. I am so lucky to have that under my belt.

What advice do you have for aspiring actors?

I definitely would say to keep taking classes and keep auditioning. You usually book the biggest job right when you feel like you want to give up. But if you love acting, then eventually something will stick.

Kate was first announced as part of the cast back in March 2021.

Warped! follows Milo (Anton Starkman), the beloved head geek at a popular strip-mall comic book shop, Warped!, finds his world disrupted when his boss hires a new employee. With the quirky and excitable Ruby (**Godfrey**) now on the payroll, the two form an unlikely alliance to create the world's greatest graphic novel.

Joining them in their adventures are Darby (Ariana Molkara), a smart and fashion-forward friend who is always there to lend a hand, and Hurley (Christopher Martinez), a neighboring pizza shop employee who spends his time coming up with brilliant culinary creations.

Just Jared Jr Exclusive Interview With Kate Godfrey

JJJ: Can you tell us about your character?

KG: Ruby is energetic and ready to take on any challenge head first. She is unapologetically Ruby, which is something I really admire about her.

JJJ: Are there many similarities between you and Ruby?

KG: Ruby and I are extremely similar. The only difference is that Ruby is a lot more extroverted than I am. Ruby is not afraid to embarrass herself; she almost looks forward to it, I definitely cannot relate to that. She is also very physical; always moving, jumping, climbing, falling, you name it. The amount of bruises I get playing Ruby is crazy.

JJJ: What has your experience been like working on this new show?

AG: My experience working on *Warped!* has been wonderful. The environment we have created on set is so positive and uplifting. I think the entire cast and crew genuinely enjoys working on the show. Everyone is excited to show up to work every day, which makes me so happy.

JJJ: What is your favorite part about Warped?

KG: My favorite part about Warped is working with **Anton Starkman**, **Arianna Molkara**, and **Chris Martinez**. We go to dinner every Friday night after filming all day. We all enjoy spending time together, which makes our jobs even more fun. We have a special bond that only really comes when you are on television together.

JJJ: What do you hope fans take away from watching the show?

KG: I hope they laugh!!! Almost every line of *Warped* is a punchline, thanks to our show creators **Kevin**, **Kevin**, and **Heath**. We have a great time making it, so I hope the viewers see that.

JJJ: Do you have a favorite BTS moment so far?

KG: My favorite BTS moment was probably working with live animals. Weirdly enough, we have tons of live animals on Warped, so I have encountered some crazy animals in the last few months. When there is a "wild" animal on set, everyone has to be really quiet so it doesn't get scared and run all around our set. When 150+ people are all being quiet and have their eyes on a zoo animal, it is pretty funny. You never know what the animals are going to do. I also really love performing physical comedy, which is something I get to do a lot in this show.

JJJ: The show is centered in a comic book store. Are you a huge comic fan?

KG: I'm actually bad at knowing anything pop culture related ever, it is actually pretty funny. **Anton** has tried to get me into comics and superheroes. I am starting by making my way through the Avengers series right now. That is the biggest difference between me and Ruby: I know nothing about pop culture.

JJJ: If so, what's your favorite comic?

KG: "Diary of a Wimpy Kid"

JJJ: Aside from the sketch part, what's the biggest difference between *Warped!* and your last Nickelodeon show *All That*?

KG: I think the biggest difference that I have noticed is that I am able to develop and work on a single character rather than a ton of characters at one time. I absolutely adore sketch comedy and love learning the science of it, so it was a new idea to play and develop only one character. It is also a much smaller cast, so we are able to really get to know each other and spend time all together.

JJJ: What did you learn on *All That* that you were able to bring to *Warped*?

KG: *All That* was the craziest experience of my life. Although I wasn't on set as much as I am for Ruby, it still was craziness. I had so much fun on that show; it was literally my playground. I could play any character I wanted and be whoever I wanted to be. *All That* is where I found my passion for comedy, which is something I will forever be grateful for. Most of my comedic training is from *All That*, which I think is really apparent in *Warped*. When Ruby was presented to me she was described as a mixture of all my *All That* characters, which I completely agree with.

WARPED!: KATE GODFREY DISCUSSES NICKELODEON SITCOM

Kate Godfrey chatted about her time on Nickelodeon's All That revival and leading the network's new sitcom, Warped!

You may recognise Kate Godfrey from Nickelodeon's recent *All That* revival. However, she's now leading a new sitcom *Warped!*, also on Nickelodeon. The new show was created by Kevin Kopelow and Heath Seifert, also known for their work on the original *All That* and Disney Channel's *Austin and Ally*, among others.

You appeared on the *All That* revival and now lead your own show, *Warped*! How have you found working for Nickelodeon and the differences between the shows?

Kate Godfrey: Working on *All That* versus working on *Warped!* has been completely different. On *All That*, there were 8 main cast members. You're not in everything every week, you have your 'buddy'. You guys switch doing these characters. It was so fun. I love sketch comedy so much and being on *All That* was truly such a learning, wonderful experience for me.

Warped! is just... Anton Starkman and I, we're on set. Sometimes we never leave except for lunch breaks. I love it, it's my passion in life. It's a lot, compared to *All That*, for sure. I was like, "Woah, this is crazy."

Nickelodeon has produced a long line of hit shows – the original *All That, Kenan and Kel, iCarly* and *Victorious* to name a few. Did you have a 'Nickelodeon idol' you looked up to when you were younger?

Kate Godfrey: When I was really little, I was a *Dora* fanatic. I cut my bangs to look like Dora. At one point, I only knew Spanish because my nanny only spoke Spanish. My mom couldn't communicate with me because I was only speaking Spanish.

When I got a little older, it was definitely more like iCarly or Victorious. You know, the classic staple shows.

As for *Warped!* – what's it about? How would you describe the show's premise and the creative team behind it?

Kate Godfrey: *Warped!* is Nickelodeon's new sitcom. It is about a comic-book store and follows Milo, Ruby, Darby and Hurley throughout their adventures in the nerd life. It's very funny!

From an acting perspective, how different is it playing one character versus several from *All That* sketches?

Kate Godfrey: I like to think of Ruby as a mixture of all my *All That* characters. She rambles a lot, like TMI Tammy. The second episode she was almost, like, drunk, I want to say. [Like] 'Brie, Back From The Dentist.' She's very much a mixture of my *All That* characters. That's kind of what Kevin, Kevin and Heath [Kay, Kopelow and Seifert, Executive Producers] explained to me.

It's been weird, having only one character. I love that I can literally make any choice as Ruby and still be in character. She's so fun and sporadic.



Speaking of 'Ruby' would you say she's similar to other roles you've played or even to yourself?

Kate Godfrey: I made a Pinterest board when I first heard about Ruby. I basically pinned everything I thought would be Ruby-esque. Phoebe from Friends was on it, just a lot of clothes that reminded me of her. Hairstyles and animals, even. She's definitely a mix of everything I wanted her to be and everything Kevin & Heath made her be.

Having done an improv series first and then scripted, do you have as much creative freedom? Or, do you stick to what's written for each episode of *Warped*!?

Kate Godfrey: One thing I really love about Kevin, Kevin and Heath is that they really let me have freedom in what I and all the other kids say. If I think something's funny, I'll just do it. They've made this really safe environment to where I don't really care if it's not funny. They'll be like, "Let's not do that." I'll be like, "Okay, cool."

I'm constantly doing things and hoping for the best. I'd say there's a lot of improv, I improv a lot. I want to stick to the script because we want to tell a linear story. But, I think we all add funny little things that we think could be funny.




Where can people find you on social media?

Actress Kate Godfrey is "all that" and then some! The talented young performer first blew audiences away with her starring role in the remake of the '90s sketch comedy, *All That*. Since then, she's continued to build on that success, landing the lead role in Nickelodeon's *Warped!*.

In *Warped!*, Milo (Anton Starkman), the beloved head geek at a popular strip-mall comic book shop, Warped!, finds his world disrupted when his boss hires a new employee. With the quirky and excitable Ruby (Kate Godfrey) now on the payroll, the two form an unlikely alliance to create the world's greatest graphic novel. Joining them in their adventures are Darby (Ariana Molkara), a smart and fashion-forward friend who is always there to lend a hand, and Hurley (Christopher Martinez), a neighboring pizza shop employee who spends his time coming up with brilliant culinary creations.

Pop Culturalist was lucky enough to speak with Kate about Warped!.

PC: To start, could you introduce us to the series and your character?

Kate: *Warped!* is Nickelodeon's new sitcom. It first airs on Thursday, January 20th, but you can watch it every Thursday at 7:30/6:30c. I play Ruby. She's super fun to play. She's very exciting. I think she's going to be very loved by the fan base. She's overall just a spazball.

PC: What was it about this particular project and character that attracted you to it?

Kate: Ruby is a mixture of all the characters that I used to play on *All That*. She's really my dream character because I can do anything in the role. I could make any choice or say anything improvised, and it would still be considered as Ruby in character. It's my dream role. I love it.

PC: How did you prepare to step into Ruby's shoes? Which of Ruby's relationships was your favorite to explore in Season 1?

Kate: When I first heard about Ruby, I made a Pinterest board and basically pinned anything that reminded me of Ruby. I pinned anything, from hairstyles to baby goats (because she reminds me of a goat). I created what I wanted to wear. All of those things. It was fun.

PC: How similar or different would you say you are to Ruby?


Kate: I'd say I go back and forth on whether I'm similar or not. I feel like I'm pretty similar. She's more of a super exaggerated sitcom character, which I'm not. I'm quite introverted. I can be shy, whereas Ruby isn't. But ultimately, I think our personalities are pretty similar.

PC: The cast has such great chemistry. How did you all build that bond?

Kate: Right away, we knew that if we wanted this to be a good show it would be helpful if we were really close, so we were all on the same page. We were like, "Let's do as many things as we can together. Let's be really closed," and it worked. It was so natural, and sometimes we were with each other for fifteen hours a day. We would work all day and then we'd go get dinner and hang out with each other for four hours after. It was super organic. It was nice. We have a really nice environment.

PC: The show looks like so much fun. Do you have a favorite episode or scene that you're really excited for your fans to see?

Kate: I do have a favorite scene! It's hard to say because there are so many good ones. Ruby is such a little oddball, which I love. You'll have to watch and see because every episode she's doing something new and crazy and acting in some way or impersonating a random person. You'll have to watch every Thursday night on Nick.

KATE GODFREY ON COMEDY, 'WARPED!', AND SO MUCH MORE!



o celebrate the premiere of Nickelodeon's brand new show Warped!, TEENPLICITY spoke with the cast to get to know their characters, what audiences can expect from the series, and so much more! Check out what Kate Godfrey has to say about her character Ruby below!

It's evident in the way she commands the screen that Kate Godfrey is a rising star.

The actress excels at comedy. Already racking up credits on her resume that include starring in the revival of *All That* and appearing on *The Tonight Show with Jimmy Fallon*, her comedic timing is spot on and the ease with which it flows from her is surely enviable.

"I would love to be a cast member of [*Saturday Night Live*] at some point in my life. It is a lot of work, but *All That* made me realize how much I love sketch comedy," Kate says when discussing her future in the genre. *All That* alum Kenan Thompson currently stars on the late-night sketch comedy show, holding the record for the longest-tenured cast member on the series for over 18 years so far. While it's possible for her to follow in his footsteps, she is keeping her options open. "I would also love to do some comedy movies – everybody loves a good comedy movie."

While Kate shares that she loves any form of comedy, she does have one particular area of interest. "My favorite comedy to perform is probably situational comedy. I like the idea of a funny sitcom or when things are funny just because of the environment."

It comes as no surprise that Kate signed onto Nickelodeon's latest series, Warped!.





Created by Kevin Kopelow and Heath Seifert, producers of *All That* and creators of Disney's <u>Austin & Ally</u> and Nickelodeon's *Cousins for Life, Warped!* follows lovable geek Milo [<u>Anton Starkman</u>] who works at the local comic book shop, Warped!. He finds his world turned inside out when his boss hires a new employee, the eccentric and excitable Ruby [Godfrey]. Soon enough, the two learn to work together as they create their own graphic novel.

"Ruby is a spaz ball. She is always coming up with ideas that will get the gang into trouble," Kate says of her character. "I love playing Ruby because I could literally make any funny choice and it would be considered 'in character."

Ruby makes quick friends with Darby [<u>Ariana Molkara</u>] once she is hired, instantly bonding over their excitement for a character from the show's fictional alien franchise. "Ruby fits in perfectly with Milo's friends because they are all unapologetically themselves," she says of Ruby's friendships with Darby and Hurley [<u>Christopher</u> <u>Martinez</u>]. "They all share the same love for comic books, which bonds them very quickly. Even though she is absolutely nuts, they really take her under their wing."

It does, however, take time for Ruby and Milo to find their footing.

"Ruby and Milo start as extremely competitive, but they grow to appreciate each other and work together. They are completely different people, which makes their relationship very interesting to watch. Ruby makes a lot of silly and illogical mistakes, and Milo has to find a logical way to solve them."

Ruby's employment at Warped! initially worries Milo about his own job security but they are able to overcome it. Like Milo, Ruby is a whiz at all things comics, possibly the only one who can match Milo's knowledge.

"I honestly know nothing about comics compared to Ruby," Kate admits. She does say that she has tried to educate herself on comics because of the show. A hobby that holds her interest in a similar way that comics do for Ruby is painting. "I love painting. My friend Quinn recently got me into it. I have been trying to learn the tips and tricks of oil paint – it's pretty fun!" The actress shares that it is a new hobby, but it is one that she thoroughly enjoys. "I have ruined *sooooo* many sweatshirts and furniture with oil paint." She adds, "Oops."

Another passion Kate has is writing. When asked if that is something she'd love to bring to her character, the actress says, "One of the things that makes Milo and Ruby such a great team is that Milo is really good at writing and Ruby is really good at drawing. Together they make a graphic novel that they are trying to get published. However, I would love to see Ruby learn some tips and tricks about writing from Milo." She continues, "I love writing stories so I bet Ruby would too." With the show having only just premiered, there is plenty in store to keep viewers' attention as the season progresses. For Kate, she's most excited for the audience to see all the fun characters that Ruby plays. "She is always in disguises and acting as random people. They are very similar to the characters I played on *All That*. I love playing weirdos so I am lucky that Ruby does too."

Her favorite Ruby disguise in the series comes in a later episode where Kate gets to portray Ruby as a teenaged boy. "I absolutely love playing a boy because it is the furthest thing away from the actual me," she says. "It is so fun to do little mannerisms and drop my voice."

Discussing a dream guest star for the show also gives Kate the idea for the role they could play, relating it back to her favorite disguise.

"I would have Kate McKinnon guest star on the show and I would make her character be my boy character's dad. We could both play boys together. That would be fun."

Considering the fact that the show revolves around the ongoings of the group at their local comic store, **TEENPLICITY** couldn't help but dive more into Kate's knowledge and preferences of comics.

Though she says she isn't as well-versed in comic books as her character, she recalls her favorite comic book growing up to be a tie between *Diary of a Wimpy Kid* and *Captain Underpants*. "I think it would be funny to have Captain Underpants on the show, but a little weird," she says.

What if she could be any comic book character? The answer is easy for the rising star as she chooses Spider-Man. "I love all the Spider-Man movies and I think his powers are really cool. Being able to swing from building to building would be very helpful getting to work everyday."

Her answer is almost expected then when discussing her favorite comic book movie. "My favorite superhero movie is either the new Spider-Man movie or any of the Iron Man movies. I think the Iron Man movies are the best Marvel movies; they are pretty funny."

ANTON STARKMAN: Milo is obsessed with all things comics. He also likes things done in a specific way and he's stressed out most of the time because his friends definitely do not do things his way.

KATE GODFREY: Ruby is a ball of energy. She is constantly coming up with silly ideas that, somehow, she convinces Milo to do. Ruby and Milo are so different that it makes this show fun to watch.

J-14: If you made your own graphic novel like your characters do, what

would it be about?

AS: I would write a space adventure about a hero discovering their superpowers. I would want the story to be realistic because I've always admired heroes that amaze us as well as teach real-world skills. Having started her career at a young age, the talented actress continuously works on having confidence in herself and stars in the successful reboot of ALL THAT. With the support from those around her, Godfrey has many goals in mind and continues to strive for them every day. Full of light, we are excited to see where her journey takes her next! Tell us more about your role on ALL THAT. How has your experience been on set?

Working on All That has been a dream come true. I have discovered a passion for creating characters. I love transforming into someone who is so far off from who I actually am. My experience on set has been wonderful. I love all my cast members, and I truly feel like I am part of a family.

With the show being a reboot, what are some key things you had to do to get into this role/mindset?

All throughout the audition process, my homework was to watch old clips of the original All That. I didn't know the show was a reboot until right before I booked the job. I assumed it would be similar to All That, with the executive producers being Kel Mitchell and Kenan Thompson, but the show was called "Untitled Sketch Show" during all my auditions.

Have you always wanted to be an actress?

When I was younger, I played softball and soccer. I lived in Arizona, it was super hot, and I was never excited about playing in my games every weekend. My parents saw an audition notice for the community theatre in our neighborhood. It was in air conditioning, so I was on board. I quit softball and began acting. In my first ever show I played a dancing fork. I wore a cardboard fork on my back. I loved it. I did every single kids show at that community center until I was too old to participate. Ever since then I knew I wanted to act and perform for a living.

You are starting off your career young. So far, what are some key lessons you think you have learned?

What are some things you see yourself having to continue working on?

You act, sing, and dance. How do you balance it all?

Practicing all of my hobbies is hard, but I genuinely love to do all three. Practicing acting, singing, and dancing doesn't seem like a task, but a break. If I am overwhelmed about school or work I will go in my room and sing or play the piano.

Have you written any songs? If so, what are they about? If no, what would you like to write about?

I love to write. I have written a lot of things, and I have taken a few scene writing classes. I am still improving, but writing is definitely something I would love to pursue.

Walk us a through a typical day before being on set.

Before filming and going on set, we go through a very long hair and makeup process. Depending on the sketch, we could be in Hair and Makeup for up to three hours! Although we are there for a while, it is a lot of fun. Our hair and makeup artists are very entertaining, so the time flies by. Other things I do while waiting for my makeup/hair to be done are run my lines, talk to my cast members, or go on my phone.

Who has been your biggest support as you continue on this journey? My biggest supporters have been my family. My parents and siblings have made so many sacrifices for me to reach my goals. Without my family, I could have never booked All That.

What are some goals you hope to achieve?

I have so many goals I would like to achieve in my lifetime. I would like to be a cast member of Saturday Night Live, be in a movie, win an Emmy, an Oscar, and be on Broadway. Those are just a few! I may not get to all of them, but I will have fun trying.

"All That," a "Saturday Night Live"-like comedy sketch series for kids, originally captivated kids' attention on Nickelodeon from 1994-2016. But this time, there's a revival of "All That" for the new generation coming to Nick on Saturday, June 15, and a 15-yearold Scottsdale native is part of the cast.

Kate Godfrey's first role was in "Beauty and The Beast" as a dancing fork at the Homestead Playhouse in DC Ranch when she was 9 years old. So that means she's a triple threat: She can act, dance and sing. She also starred in Arizona Theatre Company's "Fiddler on the Roof" and she played teen Fiona in "Shrek The Musical" at 5-Star Theatricals in Thousand Oaks, California. She decided to pursue a career in L.A., where her adventures took her to "All That" auditions. See what Kate Godfrey has to say about working with the original "All That" cast including Kenan Thompson, Lori Beth Denberg, Kel Mitchell and Josh Server, portraying comedic roles and meeting the Jonas Brothers.

Question: Had you watched any of the original "All That" episodes before getting the role?

Answer: Before I got the roll I actually saw a little bit of "The Amanda Show," and when I was auditioning for the show, they didn't know what it was called yet. It was called "Untitled Sketch Show," but they said watch "All That" for reference. So during the audition process, I actually watched a lot of "All That" even though I didn't know it was going to be that.

Q: How are you guys approaching the show differently this time around?

A: It's basically the exact same "All That" except it has a modern twist on it and a new cast and we're still having original cast members. They have cameos here and there, it's really great.

Q: Speaking of the original cast, what was it like working with them?

A: They are so sweet and supportive, and it's really nice to know that they're supporting us because they were in our shoes in the '90s. And so to know that we can ask them for advice or if we need any help with anything or if we had any questions, we can ask them and they'll happily answer them. It's really nice to know that.

Q: One of the early musical guests for "All That" is the Jonas Brothers. Did you get to meet them?

A: Yes, I did get to meet them. I actually was lucky enough to get to do a scene with them, and it was so crazy. They're so sweet. And yeah, they basically look exactly how they look on TV. I watched them a lot when I was growing up and it's very cool to know that they are back together as well. And doing a scene with them was very surreal. I got to do a Good Burger sketch with them.

Q: What are you most excited for people to see?

A: I'm excited for them to see all the crazy sketches because we definitely do a lot of crazy things. ... I play Marie Kiddo. It's actually on YouTube. And I got to destroy a cabinet and a ton of other stuff.

It was so much fun to film. I was a little nervous smashing the glass cabinet. Because they kept saying, "If you get glass in your shoes, stop and tell us to hold and we'll hold." And then I was like, "Wait? I'm going to get glass in my shoes?" But it was really fun.

Q: How do you handle comedic roles?

A: I think just going for it and having no fear. And being OK with the fact that the choices you make might not always be funny, but in order to be funny you have to make choices. So you really just have to trust yourself and be confident in what you're doing. Right now basically anything we film I think is so funny. All this stuff has been hilarious. I don't know how the writers do it. Every little thing is so funny. Even if it doesn't make it to camera and it just makes it to a table reading.

Q: This show looks like it has a lot of costumes. What was that like?

A: We have a ton of fun costumes. Our hair and makeup and wardrobe team are so amazing and all the costumes blow me away. Sitting in the hair and makeup chair sometimes takes longer than it actually takes to film the sketch. They make it look perfect, and the makeup is amazing, the hair is amazing.

They're super articulate wigs. It's amazing how much work goes into a two minute sketch.

Q: So according to your IMDb page, your first role was a dancing fork?

A: Yes, I decided to try theater and I was really nervous. ... I just wanted to get out of the heat because you know it's very hot in Arizona. And I didn't like sports. So my mom was like, "The Homestead is doing 'Beauty and The Beast.' Want to try out?" And I was like, "Yeah, I guess so." I remember that for the audition process I was so nervous. I think I had to sing and I had to pretend to be a clock. I remember that oddly weird detail, but I don't know why I remember pretending to be a clock. And then I was a cardboard fork.

Q: Being from Scottsdale, how has experience here helped with your career?

A: I think most everything I got in Arizona is so helpful to me right now. You can't just go into this having no training. Even my role as a dancing fork at the Homestead helped me and prepared me for this. And also Arizona Theatre Company. Just performing on stage definitely prepared me for this. Every Friday we have live audiences, so I think theater training really helped me.

Q: I know it's summer break right now, but is it tough to balance school and work?

A: It's pretty hard. You definitely have to work harder than other kids who don't act and don't have a full-time job. We do school on set for three hours. At the most we do five hours, but sometimes we do one to five hours of school a day. You just have to work harder than other kids that aren't in the industry. And you have to keep in mind that education is just as important as your job.

What was your reaction when you got the call that you were cast on the new *All That*?

Kate Godfrey: I think we all had the same reaction which was excited and happy. I cried. I was so happy. No words. It was amazing.

Nathan Janak: I cried as well and Chinguun can vouch for me that I was literally bawling because when I found out I was on the side of the street. We just got out of the test, the final stage of the audition, and so I got the call 20 minutes after that. We were still getting an Uber to go back home and I was just crying so badly. Chinguun Sergelen: I was at The Grove when I got the call and I was running around the waterfalls that they had. I was crying, as was Nathan.

Gabrielle Green: When I got the call I was very, very sick. I was sweating. I had a very bad headache, I remember, but I was home with my aunt. My mom called and she conferenced me in with my agent and manager and my agent goes, "Hey, I know you're sick, but you know what the best cure for a cold is?" I was like, "What?" My agent said, "You booked *All That*." The headache and everything, the sweat, was just gone. I got up and I just started running around the room and then the call dropped and I was so upset. I kept calling my mom back saying, "Conference me back in, conference me back in." But she handled it.



Ryan Alessi: My story is not as interesting as their story, but I was driving out of a Best Buy. My mom was there and our manager told us that she wouldn't call us. She'd only call us if she had any news about the show and her number was on my mom's phone. So my manager, my agent, and I are on a three-way call and they said, "Guess what? You booked *All That.*" My mom and I went absolutely crazy.

Lex Lumpkin: When I got the call, I was out front of a commercial audition and I was super happy. I was in shock didn't say anything because I wasn't sure if they had gotten the information right. When I got the role I was super happy, super excited, and pumped.

It's been a long time since the '90s when we first saw All That. With this new cast and reboot, is it different from the original show or does the heart of the show stay the same?

Lex Lumpkin: I feel that the new reboot still stays true to the original, but it's more modernized with new kids and it still brings back some of the old sketches and the original cast. Nathan Janak: It's the same old *All That* with a brand-new cast. It's classic sketches, the same type of comedy, with an all-new cast and maybe some even old cast members, too.





What was it like for you all to work with some of the original *All That* cast members?

Gabrielle Green: Just getting to work with them is such an honor. They constantly are making sure we're comfortable with everything and making sure we understand everything. They're just like our big brothers and sisters and second parents. It's so amazing. Getting to go to work every day, you can't be sad with Kel Mitchell in the room because he's always like, "Hey guys, what's up?" So if you're having a bad day, Kel's the guy to call for sure. He's always giving us advice and always reminding us that this show is not what makes you special. You were born special.

Kate Godfrey: They're just so supportive. Since they were in our same shoes in the '90s, they know what it's like and they're giving us a bunch of advice. It's very helpful especially because we're all new at this and we've never shot something this big before.

Ryan Alessi: Overall, Nickelodeon has just been super awesome to us. The production's great. Every single person plays a part in making this project so good and perfect and making sure the cast is happy and making sure the writers are happy. It's super awesome that we've become a family. We're hanging out with each other all day, every day.

What's it like working with each other?

Reece Caddell: Working with this cast is probably one of the most amazing things I've ever done. They are so supportive because they know exactly what we're doing and they have the same feelings because we're all in this together.

Gabrielle Green: We all love each other. I think I speak for everyone when I say these are some of the best friends that I've ever had in my entire life. I really trust these people and that's really hard for me because I don't trust people a lot, but we've really built a strong community, including Kel, Lori Beth, Josh, and all the OGs. We're really tight and that's really important in this kind of show because with all the improv and all the sketch comedy characters, you really have to trust each other.

Nathan Janak: To add on what everyone said, we really all just love working together whether t's off-screen or on-screen. We just have a personal chemistry and connection with one another. It's just a magical thing. I'm so grateful that I get to work with you guys and that we all have this opportunity. Y'all are just the bestest friends in the entire world.

Ryan Alessi: We're sort of like the cast of *Friends*, just like sketch comedy this time.

All That has been had so many fans since it premiered 25 years ago. What do you think makes fans keep loving All That after all these years?

Lex Lumpkin: I think what makes the fans love *All That*, specifically, is because of all the new sketches each week. There are new characters and the cast never holds back. They love what they do. They're always going full-on to make the people laugh and it's awesome that the cast just loves doing what they're doing and making people laugh.



Nathan Janak: I think the all-new *All That* is going to make some of the people who watched it back in the '90s feel like a kid again watching it on their screen because it really is, like we've all said before, the same type of comedy.

Ryan Alessi: It's the same two writers, **Kevin Kopelow** and **Heath Seifert**. They were writers for the old *All That*, too. Plus, they have some new amazing writers that have come on and it's just a really talented group of people.
